While in graduate school, I have been experimenting, trying to both hone and expand my aesthetics. It is my goal to present myself as a confident and adaptable designer—to take the director's concept and, rather than just give them what they ask for, give them even more than they could imagine. I strive to stay humble, to take suggestion without being defensive or protective of my design, to take risks and make changes with out hesitation, all in the hope of creating a more cohesive and accessible final product. Looking back on my work, I have created designs that are bold yet simple. With each design I focused on creating or enhancing the world of the play, the location, or the mood. I have often found that limiting my options keeps design choices and ideas clear. I have tried to open my mind and learn from as many

designers and artists as I can. As a creator of moods and spaces, it seems essential to pull inspiration from everywhere.
