based on Psalm 6

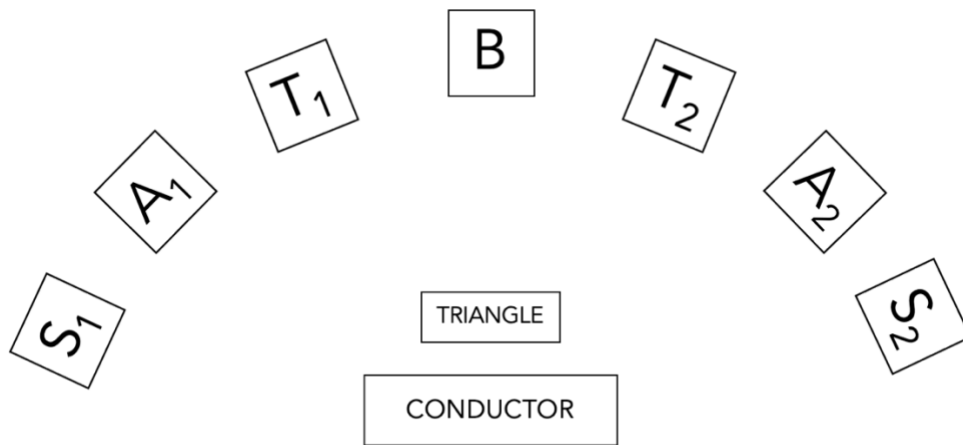
About

Psalm 6 is one of seven Penitential Psalms, written to express the sorrow of being a sinner. “For there is no one in death, that is mindful of thee: and who shall confess to thee in hell? I have laboured in my groanings, every night I will wash my bed: I will water my couch with my tears.” These lines struck a chord in me, in a retreat where I reflected deeply on the sins that I had committed.

For me, this Psalm had accentuated the regret and desolation I felt when I refused to accept the trials that were placed before me. Back in 2018, as a rather secular member of the society, I blamed God for tribulations and my life was overcast with anger. I refused to listen to the Word of God and never thought of it as a sin. It was only when my life was transformed by unfathomable miracles that I started to repent and seek forgiveness. The music of *A Prayer in Distress* seeks to bring out these struggles and emotions.

The piece also endeavours to explore tonality in three different aspects, namely: Modal Music, Diatonic Music and Octatonic Music. Although these aspects are starkly different, the harmonies formed by altering combinations of notes (or like thereof) to create different harmonic effects is something that had greatly interest me in the last two years.
