













play this descending line once at any point until your next written chord (bar 74). you can play all pitches or skip some. very slow.


listen to the harp. every time you hear it, play any pitch from the set. always play single notes. your notes are a soft resonance of the harp, F1. Ob. a soft colouring of the sound. you can wait few moments after the harp sound and then play your note. keep the notes for between 6 and 12 beats. don't play in bar 92.




play the chords at any point until your next written chord (bar 92). separate the chords with silences. repeat them. free order.

when you hear the harp, play one of your written chords. your chords are a soft resonance of the harp, a soft colouring of the sound. keep the chords for between 6 and 12 beats. you don't have to play every time the harp plays, if you decided to hold the chord longer. don't play in bar 92.










when you hear harp's chord, play any pitch from that same chord in same manner as before - a soft, prolongued resonance of harp's sound. play together. hold notes for 4-8 beats. don't play in bar 108.




play this chord one or more times at any point until your next written chord (bar 108). simultaneously. (give cue to woodwinds)

when the harp plays the first chord, play your written chord and keep it until bar 108. your chord is a soft resonance.









choose notes from the collection.
play them synchronized with each
other, at any point throughout
this section, until accordion starts
playing. play long notes on one breath.



follow the strings taking the fishing lines. pick your end of the line and hold it tight.

play this chord 3 times spread out through this section (the string quartet is repeating the sections from bar 58)






when the strings start bowing the fishing lines, slowly prepare the pedals to following: D#, C, B#, E, F, G#, A

repeat this chord sequence. start anytime after the percussion stops playing. leave silences between the sequences. always play the chords in the written order. soft, slow, relatively long. after the ropes are cut, slowly finish your sequence, or play it once more if you feel the atmosphere asks for it.





repeat the whole section from bar 58. this time play only the circled notes. start together and after few chords get out of sync, starting to count 5-7, later 4-8 beats per note. use all durations equally. when finished, slowly, one by one take the ropes attached to the harp strings. play long notes bowing the ropes and listenning to the resonance coming from the harp. play until the ropes are cut by the percussionist.


repeat 5 times every time add an extra beat to the length of your note







changing the pedals as indicated. give time to every pedal change. let each chord sound for a while before you change the pedals again. repeat until the ropes are cut by the percussionist.





bowing fishing lines



let the ensemble play this section for a while then take the siccors and very casually cut the fishing lines.

set up



play quietly throughout the piece. very little or no vibrato. long notes are flat. no accented attacks. no diminuendo at the end of the notes. first section should sound like the organ.

percussion: choose and combine several instruments. your sound is dry, a cold and uncompromising pulse. muted drums, pieces of (not too resonant) wood, etc.

four fishing lines are extending from string quartet to woodwind duo through specific harp strings. attach clips to both ends of each line:



make sure that lines are touching the indicated harp strings:

line 1: from viola to flute touching



line 2: from double bass 1 to flute touching



line 3: from violoncello to oboe touching



line 4: from double bass 2 to oboe touching



string quartet bows the fishing lines all lines should be bowed with double bass bows woodwind duo is holding their end of the line tightly harp strings resonate the indicated chord harpist is changing the pedals as written in the score

scissors are hanging from the ceiling in front of the ensemble, also on the fishing line. at the end of the piece, the percussionist walks to the front, cuts the line holding the scissors and slowly cuts the four lines one by one. do this naturally. no acting. no drama.
