Group Grounding


- Listen well for deep understanding and respect



Broadening the Horizons - Conversation Café

Questions:

- What was difficult during and after COVID-19 and did you find any unexpected solutions?
- What actually turned out as a positive outcome that you might not have explored if it wasn't for the pandemic?

Agreements

- Try to listen, not judge
- Respect one another
- Seek to understand
- Invite and honor diverse opinions
- Go for honesty and depth without going on and on

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Steps

- 1. Use the talking object in the 1st round
- 1st round: speak without interruption Option to pass. People without the talking object *listen* (~10 minutes)
 - Host: ensure everyone abides by the Agreements (e.g., make sure everyone gets a turn)
- 1. 2nd round: lively conversation together (~10 minutes)
- 2. 3rd round: decide 1 to 3 "takeaways" to share with whole group(~3 minutes, use sticky notes)

- Keep readjusting






