The Supreme Court's decision in Olmstead attempted to address the issue of institutionalization for persons with disabilities; however, many individuals with mental illness continue to be warehoused, albeit temporarily, in our nation's nursing homes, a stop-gap measure as yet untouched by the Olmstead decision. McNally will identify the legal framework that created this stop-gap, as well as provide a framework for understanding why nursing homes are inappropriate and ill-prepared to address the medical and non-medical needs of individuals with mental illness.
