A certain amount of flexibility can be taken in the performing of the more complex rhythms to give a feeling of spontaneity. Quarter-tones are to be played as closely as possible to half the frequency of a semi-tone.

stolen glimpses of eternity for string quartet uses ancient Greek music theory and philosophy as its springboard. Originally it was a 23 minute work expressing the feeling of those moments which feel either eternally beautiful or frightful and was influenced by the period of painful waiting when my father was terminally ill with leukemia. This five minute extract is the last four sections of the work which was based on a never ending number series by Gottfried Leibniz. The last sections reflect on the eternal feeling of the elements starting with rain, ice, snow and ending with 'no time'.
