Diller will discuss how current guardianship law fails to establish proper procedural protections for individuals under guardianship. It can be extremely difficult for individuals under guardianship to challenge their guardian's decisions or to terminate the guardianship, despite periods of transition during which the individual may regain decision-making capacity. Epstein and Rosenbaum will highlight the historical treatment of persons with developmental disabilities and California's current legal scheme for addressing issues of supports, services, self-determination, and interdependence.
