This volume contains 30 of the 44 presentations given at the 32nd Japanese/Korean Linguistics Conference (JK 32), held at Cornell University June 13-15, 2025. The presentations comprised 14 posters and 30 papers, 6 by our distinguished guest speakers: Wesley Jacobsen (Harvard University); Yoonjung Kang (University of Toronto); EunHee Lee (University at Buffalo); William O’Grady (University of Hawai‘i at Mānoa); and Yosuke Igarashi (National Institute for Japanese Language and Linguistics), who presented papers both at the main session and the satellite workshop on historical linguistics. For the first time at JK, the conference also included a satellite workshop on artificial intelligence in linguistics. Presenters came from eight countries, including Japan and Korea. The conference was attended by more than 65 participants over three days.

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
