# PEER REVIEW ROULETTE

Is an activity based on the uncertainties built into the peer review process, also known as refereeing, in scholarly publishing.

Participants spin the prize wheel and then choose a corresponding jelly bean. Whether a review is positive or negative is determined by the flavor of the bean. In order to be successfully published, participants must receive at least two positive reviews for their submission.

Forms of Peer Review include Single Blind, Double Blind, Open, and Post-Publication Review.

Single Blind: Reviewer knows identity of author. Author does not know identity of reviewer.

Double Blind: Author and reviewer identities are concealed.

Open: Identity of all parties are openly disclosed.

Post-Publication: Publication precedes reviews.
