At A Steady Consistent Rate

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AT A STEADY CONSISTENT RATE

(2017)

for seven or more performers

INSTRUMENTATION: Instruments/objects with sustaining capabilities. Piano, percussion, and plucked instruments must be used in a way that allows for an appropriate amount of sustain with only one attack.

NOTATION + PERFORMANCE: Parts consist of numbers arranged into two sections.

Solid numbers indicate sound making, empty numbers indicate silence. Section 1 has a white background, Section 2's background is yellow.

Each performer starts at the beginning and counts through all of the numbers in the order they're written. Performers should count with a steady, consistent rate of their choosing, between 40BPM and 100BPM.

MATERIAL:

Each performer chooses any single pitch to play throughout **Section 1**. This should have a soft, round quality with a precise beginning and a tapered ending. The dynamic level should be determined by whatever can help achieve a *mp-mf* ensemble dynamic; the ensemble should blend with each other in each section.

A performer may, but is not required to, permanently change pitch one time in Section 1.

In Section 2, performers play an unstable, static sound, produced by preparations to the instruments and/or 2-3 simultaneous, continuing actions. Examples follow but are by no means prescriptive or all-encompassing;

- A flutist plays D4 while singing D^b4, while simultaneously overblowing throughout the harmonic series.
- Cellist plucking string very quickly with LH, bowing with right hand, while steadily alternating between norm. and over pressure on the bridge.
- · A saxophonist playing a multiphonic while growling.
- A preparation to an instrument (paper threaded throughout the strings of a string instruments, for example) may be interpreted as 1 action.

For the purposes of this piece, a simultaneous/continuing actions may **not** include;

- a trill or tremolo between pitches.
- any sequenced action (i.e., playing three notes in a row).

Objects may be amplified if necessary. They may be tacet in Section 1 if they are not capable of producing a single pitched sound – in this case, performers should still count through the entirety of Section 1, remaining silent throughout all numbers.
