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ESTABLISHMENT OF THE GEORGE WRIGHT RESEARCH GRANT FUND

In a memorandum dated March 27, 1983, President Doug Scovill wrote, "Enclosed is a resolution, passed by the Board of Directors by telephone vote, establishing the George Wright Research Grant Fund. It came about this way.

"Russ Grater had written Bob Linn in late December inquiring if the Society had a permanent fund used to further research and education; Bob passed the letter on to me for reply. Subsequently Russ contacted Jean Matthews to see what happened to his inquiry [and] she called Ro Wauer and Ro got on my case. I called Russ and it seems that two events prompted him to inquire about donations to the Society. First, he wanted to make a donation as a memorial to Natt Dodge...who died in 1982. And second, he and his family are interested as occasion may arise in making donations to such a fund. In a telephone conversation with him he noted that they have a 50th wedding anniversary coming up and they have suggested to their children that they favor donations to the Society to mark the event. This is such a fine gesture, and so characteristic of Russ. His inquiry and persistence spurred the establishment of the Fund."

The resolution referred to is as follows:

THE GEORGE WRIGHT SOCIETY

Board of Directors

Resolution Number 83-1

February 28, 1983

TOPIC: Establishment of the George Wright Research Grant Fund.

WHEREAS, the Society fosters the application of knowledge, understanding and wisdom in the management of natural and cultural resources of parks, equivalent reserves and sites; and

WHEREAS, the Society seeks to encourage public understanding and appreciation of the importance of knowledge of the natural and cultural resources to the conservation and management of these resources;

THEREFORE, the Board of Directors, having been duly contacted by phone or in person by the President, and the majority thereof voting in the affirmative, hereby authorizes and directs the President of the Society:

1. To establish The George Wright Research Grant Fund;
2. To accept donations to the Fund on behalf of the Society;
3. To define the Fund's purposes, consistent with the Charter and the By-Laws of the Society;
4. To establish rules and standards for administration of the Fund;
5. To provide the Board of Directors with an annual report on the administration of the Fund to include donations,

income, expenses and grants given.

FURTHER, the Board authorizes the President, at his discretion, to appoint a committee to assist in the administration of the Fund; and directs the Treasurer to be the custodian of the Fund and to disburse payments from it only in accordance with the rules and standards established for its administration.
