Current Moment

- *What are the practices of care that have emerged in your community in response to the global pandemic?*
- *How has your community responded to the increased policing and surveillance that has accompanied the emergence of the pandemic?*
- *What are the most urgent sites of organizing and political education in your experience of the current moment?*

Roots and Routes

- *Describe your community's practices of remembering and archiving the past.*
- *What kinds of connection and solidarity help to bring together your communities in different locations?*

Anti-Blackness

- *If as João H. Costa Vargas argues, anti-blackness is distinct from racism, what does thinking anti-blackness as an incommensurable form of ontological terror reveal about political solidarity and multi-racial organizing?*
- *How does anti-blackness as an entry point to analysis raise the stakes of identity politics?*
 - *What does an engagement with anti-blackness offer to a critique of identity politics? What are the pitfalls of an identity without a politic? What is lost when an identity stands in for a politic?*

The Black Atlantic/Mediterranean

- *What does an attentiveness to the site of the Mediterranean open up for considerations of global forms of captivity, depravation, and state violence?*
- *In holding the Black Atlantic and the Mediterranean in the same frame, what do their historical continuities and divergences compel us to consider in relation to diasporic frameworks of analysis? Where does diaspora further our capacity for political imagining and relation? Where does it fail?*
- *What political practices and struggles are born from the geopolitical space of the sea?*

Worldmaking

- *What does a decolonized world look like in your community? Describe a liberated world.*
- *What imaginations, collaborations, commitments, and actions would make a new world possible?*
