### TEBELAK APPLAUDS TEID TEAM

Ruby Tebelak, the new TEID Head, says her goal is to enhance communication within LBNL by growing a satisfied client base, developing a dedicated and motivated team, and earning a reputation for excellence.

After getting acquainted with each employee in TEID, Ruby applauds her team for its recent accomplishments. For example, the Photography Group, which has moved to total digital imaging, is a model for the other national laboratories. The Library now has an electronic interlibrary loan service. What's more, LBNL staff can connect directly to electronic journals from the Library's Web pages, bypassing a cumbersome login process. The Technical Writing/Editing Group has added a new service—creating pages for the World Wide Web; samples of the group's work now on the Web include LBNL's *Institutional Plan*, the *RPM*, and *PUB-3000*. The Illustration/Design Group is designing a new entry sign for the Laboratory with a bronze relief of Ernest O. Lawrence. The Archives/Records Group will be honored in Washington, DC, by Secretary O'Leary for its work on the Human Radiation Experiments Records Search and Retrieval Project.

Ruby feels that, with her team's continued support, TEID will reach its digital potential through technology such as multimedia and the World Wide Web.

#### ISS BECOMES PART OF ICSD

The incorporation of the Information Systems and Services Department (ISS) into the Information and Computing Sciences Division (ICSD) marks the first time that LBNL's central administrative and scientific computing responsibilities have been placed in the same Division. The ISS and Computing Services Departments (CSD) bring skills and responsibilities that are largely complementary into a new partnership. ISS develops and operates large financial and administrative applications, several of which are used by a wide audience of Laboratory employees. Provides system management and general utility services, but few applications have there are still several tasks that are common between ISS and ICSD, and combining these overlapping functions improves productivity.

For instance, the printing of reports for users of administrative systems on UNIX is now supported entirely by the LBNL distributed printing facility maintained within CSD. This change simplifies our organization and eliminates an area of ——duplicate service. Another improvement is the integration of UNIX user accounts for all ICSD and ISS computers into a single group. This gives the Lab a uniform way of requesting computer services regardless of the system or application reeded.

We will continue to consider other areas where improvements can be made appreciate any ideas you wish to contribute that will assist in bringing these vices closer together. Stay tuned for more improvements in the Frog-Ex Press.
