Performance Notes

Despite the exclamation points, **Welladay! Welladay!** is an intimate ceremony. The score can be performed by any number of Voices (from 1 to 12) + Piano Trio, as well as other folks, such as artists and actors. Invite the audience into the main venue by having them handwrite a word. (Audience words and instructions on the final page.) Moreover, the audience participates in the final two sections.

The music is in 12 sections performed I to VI then VI to I:

I to VI is for Piano solo. Start before the audience arrives. Play snippets of the music as if cleansing the space. Each section has a variable duration of 5-8 minutes depending on when the doors open.

VI to I is performed as a "chamber music concert." There are crumpled letters to whisper, bowls to play, laundry to fold and rocks to circle. Each section has a variable duration of 8-12 minutes, yet should feel timeless. Between each section, after a pause, paper crumples.

In the final two sections, the audience can sing "Welladay!" in II, then crumples their page with a handwritten word near their hearts in I. These paper crumples are collected in pillowcases, then tossed out the window or in another place where the audience will walk through them as they depart the concert.

This is not a sentimental work. Rather, Welladay! Welladay! provides a quietude to calm the heart.

Notation

The score is composed in an open notation. Start anywhere on the page and go anywhere. Overlap music to create resonating echos. Repetitions and variations, silence and noise, along with unisons and canons are encouraged.



play once

play once or multiple times (e.g. 3, 5, 7, 11 repetitions)

pause for any duration (without a whole rest, sound should be continuous)

prayer bowls (rin) for Violin, Cello, Piano are tuned in nearly perfect 5ths let vibrate (l.v.)

pizz, col legno and other markings are only for the bar marked

(gradually change between tempo markings through repetitions)

Italicized text actions for Voice (e.g. paddycake: snap, clap, knees)

Non-italicized text for all performers to speak once in your own time (e.g. whisper: "... be at peace again...")
















Welladay! Welladay! Wayward Love Songs | Audience Participation Notes
