Please submit manuscripts in triplicate accompanied by a self-addressed, stamped envelope no later than March 1, 1994 to Editor-in-Chief, *UCLA Historical Journal*, Department of History, University of California Los Angeles, Los Angeles, CA 90024. All submitted work should be double-spaced, including footnotes. For questions of style, consult the University of Chicago's *Manual of Style* or Kate Turabian's *A Manual for Writing Term Papers, Theses and Dissertations*. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should be no more than 40 pages in length. Because submissions are evaluated anonymously, the author's name should appear only on the title page.

The *Journal* is also interested in publishing book reviews of recently published books (of the reviewer's own choice) which focus on the issues raised by this special issue. Book reviews should include a concise synopsis of the book, a brief historiography providing context, an analysis of how the book contributes to the field, or fails to do so. Book reviews should be five to seven pages in length (double-spaced) and should conform to the requirements described above for articles. Book reviews should be sent in triplicate no later than March 1, 1994, to Book Review Editor, *UCLA Historical Journal*, Department of History, University of California, Los Angeles, Los Angeles, CA 90024.


